We invite you to consider making Symphony Nova Scotia part of YOUR legacy in our community.

The *Listen to the Future* Endowment Campaign is establishing a strong foundation upon which Symphony Nova Scotia can build for generations to come. We invite you to consider becoming part of this foundation by making provisions in your will to benefit Symphony Nova Scotia through the *Listen to the Future* Endowment Campaign.

There are several ways you can remember Symphony Nova Scotia with a planned gift including:

- A gift in your will with intention of cash, securities, stock, real estate, or tangible property
- A designation of the Symphony Nova Scotia Foundation as beneficiary of life insurance
- Life Insurance policies, RRSP, RRIF

A planned gift means that you and your heirs will reap significant financial benefits. For example, a gift of securities, stocks or bonds will not be subject to capital gains taxes. You can even add a codicil to your will and direct your executor to donate the listed securities directly to the Symphony Nova Scotia Foundation.

However, the biggest benefits are more than financial. By making a bequest to the *Listen to the Future* Endowment Campaign, you will be sharing your passion for music with those that follow. If the Symphony has been an important part of your life, you can ensure that the next generation also has the opportunity to experience the joy of live classical music.

With a legacy gift, your generosity lives beyond your lifetime.

Your gift will be carefully stewarded by the trustees of the Symphony Nova Scotia Foundation. The funds generated from the Foundation's asset base each year will be transferred to Symphony Nova Scotia as a stable, reliable source of funding. For example:

- A bequest of \$250,000 will mean more than \$10,000 in operating funds for Symphony Nova Scotia each year.
- A gift of publicly listed securities valued at \$500,000 will provide more than \$20,000 each year.

This consistent source of revenue will enable the Symphony to plan responsibly for the future and allow our orchestra to continue to delight audiences with its world-class musicianship and tremendous versatility.
